Automobile Trivia Answers

- Buick was named after (2) David D. Buick who started in the plumbing business but went on to become a pioneer in internal combustion engines which evolved into the automobile business. Just before he died he was a instructor the Detroit School of Trades.
- 2) Cadillac honors (3) Antoine de la M. Cadillac, a French military commander who founded the city of Detroit in 1701.
- 3) Chevrolet was named after (1) race car driver Louis Chevrolet. The song came later.
- 4) Chrysler was named after (4) Walter P. Chrysler. So are the Chrysler Building and the Chrysler Corporation.
- 5) Dodge was named for (4) Horace and John Dodge, early automobile pioneers.
- 6) Hudson is named after (3) Joseph L. Hudson an American businessman who founded the Hudson Department store in Detroit. He supplied the capital to Roy Chapman to start an automobile company which became the Hudson Motor Car Co.
- 7) Lincoln was named to honor (4) Abraham Lincoln. Henry Leland built the first Lincoln in 1921. Henry and Edsel Ford bought Lincoln in 1922.
- 8) Mercury was named after (2) the Roman god. Mercury was noted for his speed as the messenger of the gods.
- 9) Nash got its name from (2) Charles W. Nash who bought the Jeffery Motor Car Company in 1917 and named it after himself. Charles Nash was at one time President of Buick.
- 10) Oldsmobile was started by (3) Ransom E. Olds. After he sold the company he started the REO truck company.
- 11) Packard was named after (1) two brothers, James and William Packard, pioneers in the automobile business. They also had a partner, George Weiss.
- 12) Plymouth is named after (1)Plymouth Rock Massachusetts and the pioneering sprit of the pilgrims who landed there.
- 13) Pontiac is named for (2) Chief Pontiac. Pontiac, Michigan is also named for Chief Pontiac.
- 14) Studebaker was named for the (3) Studebaker brothers. They were known for making quality wagons in the 19th century
- 15) Willys is named for (1) John North Willys who was the U.S. Ambassador to Poland (1930-1933). He was also involved in the Overland car company which later became the Willys Overland Co. The Willys Overland Co. went bankrupt in 1942 and stopped production. However the company was sold to Kaiser Frazer, then to American Motors and then to Chrysler therefore the name lives on.
