1969 Volkswagen Type 2 Bus Owned by Sara Treleven

A very cold day this past winter I acquired this beautiful 1969 Volkswagen Type 2 Bus from a wonderful retired couple in Appleton, Wisconsin.

In the middle of February, I drove it back home to Waukesha without heat or reservations because I knew I had something special.

In my younger years, I looked forward to helping my dad in the garage while he restored his old cars. Becoming especially skilled at picking up lost nuts and bolts off the garage floor, I quickly rose to the title of Flashlight Holder, with hopes that I would someday also have my own cool car.

This iconic bus, named Homer, was born in Germany on February 20, 1969 and was originally sold to a family in Houston. Since then, it has had a few owners, was fully restored in California, and eventually made its way to Wisconsin.

With a 1600cc 58hp engine, it is not a speed demon but rather a nice reminder to relax and enjoy the scenery! A decal added to the rear window, "I wish it went faster too", is only partially true and meant more to give drivers behind us something to read while we slowly make our way across the intersection.

The bus itself sleeps four people – two adults in the rear with the seat folded down, and one adult and one child up above on separate cots. It also has a refrigerator, freezer, sink, folding tables inside and out, and an incredible amount of storage for long trips. Electrical power supplied to the bus allows for fans or heaters, depending on the day in Wisconsin. All of the seats have been reupholstered, curtains redone, and mesh coverings were provided for all the windows to keep bugs from getting in at night while also being able to enjoy the nighttime air.

The paint is not original; however, it was repainted to the eye-catching Sierra Yellow.

Although there is no power steering and sudden braking can be a challenge, the bus drives, shifts, and rides wonderfully with minimal chassis noise.

With the help of my dad, who I have handed over the title of Flashlight Holder, the bus has only required minimal mechanical repairs so far, but I have no doubt there will be plenty more in its future.

Homer has made a few successful camping trips around Wisconsin this summer and it has been most rewarding to talk to other Volkswagen bus owners and fans about their own adventures. We were hoping to be a part of the Frame Park Car Show this year because I haven't missed one since moving to Waukesha, but will be eagerly awaiting next year's show instead. I also look forward to meeting more WOCC members and learning about their cars, attending meetings, and participating in car cruises and other events. Make sure to wave if you ever see us out and about!

Some things that you can do to protect your vehicle.

- Leave the hood open if the vehicle is stored indoors.
 Rodents prefer dark places.
- Don't store pet food near the stored vehicle.
- Place traps around the vehicle.
- use electronic rodent deterrent devices that annoy rodents with strobe lights or sounds that humans can't hear.

Types of Brake Fluid



Brake fluid is the lifeblood of the brake system and is commonly overlooked. But it is an integral part of your vehicle. It is a hydraulic fluid that is responsible for one job, stopping your vehicle! Brake fluid

transfers the action of pushing on the brake pedal to the brake calipers or drums through a series of hoses and lines to stop the vehicle. Because it must operate under very demanding conditions without failure, the Department of Transportation National Highway Traffic Safety Administration regulates its performance. It must pass testing for its ability to remain fluid at a low temperature and to resist boiling at high temperature. It must be compatible with other brake fluids and brake system parts and prevent corrosion within the system.

Brake fluid is referred to by DOT and a number. The DOT stands for Department of Transportation. The higher DOT number has a higher boiling point than the lower DOT number. Most vehicles in the USA take DOT3 or 4 which are amber in color. They are glycol-based and will absorb moisture out of the air (hygroscopic is the scientific term). Therefore, you will want to keep the container tightly closed and do not open the master cylinder reservoir unless needed. That is the reason many master cylinder reservoirs are clear. Because of its likeliness to absorb moisture, and the heat generated during braking, brake fluid will degrade over time. It will become acidic, promoting the formation of rust and debris in the system, this can clog valves in an Antilock Brake Systems.

DOT 3 is the most popular. It has been in use for a long time. Fresh DOT 3 has a boiling point of 401 degrees Fahrenheit, and drops to 284 degrees Fahrenheit when degraded. This makes your brake fluid much more likely to boil. Hard braking, downhill braking for long periods, towing, or racing can speed up this process. Since DOT 3 is highly corrosive, use great care while handling. It can damage paint and should be cleaned up immediately using soap and water or a simple degreaser.

DOT 4 is beginning to be used more widely by vehicle manufacturers. It is currently used mostly by European car manufacturers. There are different types of DOT 4 brake fluid. It has a higher boiling point than DOT 3. These boiling points start at 446 degrees Fahrenheit. Additional additives in DOT 4 help reduce the acids that can form from moisture. While DOT 3 and 4 are technically intermixable, it is not recommended. The cost of DOT 4 is about twice the cost of DOT 3 and for most applications, there's little benefit to switching. There are several different types of DOT 4 so be certain you use the correct type. DOT 4 is used in some European and domestic vehicles. DOT 4 Plus, is used in Mercedes and Volvo. DOT 4 Low Viscosity, is used in some BMW models. Finally, DOT 4 Racing usually has blue color added.

DOT 5 is a silicone-based brake fluid and has a boiling point of 500 degrees Fahrenheit. Usually it has a purple color to differentiate it from the amber color of DOT 3 and 4. It doesn't absorb water quite like the glycol-based DOT3 and 4 brake fluids, but it does become foamy and the air bubbles are far more difficult to bleed out. This is why DOT 5 is not recommended for an Antilock Brake Systems. DOT 5 is not able to be mixed with any other fluid and is 4 times more expensive than DOT 3.

DOT 5.1 is a glycol-based brake fluid with a boiling point similar to DOT 4 racing brake fluids. Usually clear to amber in color. While it is technically intermixable with DOT 3 or 4, it is not recommended. DOT 5.1 is around 14 times more expensive than DOT 3.




