Engine Coolant Basics

QUESTION:



Why can't you use pure 100 percent antifreeze in a car's cooling system? You may think it would be preferable to use rather than to try to mix the proper proportions. There are many opinions. Some say it's just fine do it, others claim that pure antifreeze will damage the car's engine and cooling system. Many engine manufacturers recommend not using more than 70%-30% concentration of antifreeze and deionized water, with a 50-50 mix being preferred.

ANSWER:

There are three reasons why pure antifreeze (ethylene glycol) shouldn't be used at full concentration in an engine's cooling system.

Reason 1 Perhaps the most important reason is that pure ethylene glycol freezes between 0 degrees and minus-5 degrees Fahrenheit. It is only when pure antifreeze-coolant is mixed with water that its freezing point is lowered. So if you need protection in freezing temperatures, you had best mix the antifreeze with deionized water in the proportions recommended by either the car manufacturer or antifreeze manufacturer. Playing guessing games or trying to alter the manufacturer's suggested proportions only will harm your engine.

Reason 2 Is the flip side of Reason 1. Pure antifreeze-coolant doesn't have the heat-transfer abilities that a mixture of 50% antifreeze coolant and 50% water does. In fact, if pure antifreeze-coolant is used in a car's cooling system, the system loses about 35 percent of the heat-transfer capabilities that it otherwise would have when antifreeze is mixed with the proper amount of water. Now that may not sound too important in cold weather, but it is critical in hot weather, especially in our power-accessory-laden vehicles where engine temperatures can soar. The engine cooling system must have the ability to absorb heat and carry it away from the engine, the faster the better.

Reason No. 3 Is water must be mixed with the antifreeze-coolant in order to keep the performance additives (silicates, phosphates and nitrates) suspended. Without water, these important additives tend to settle. If they do, you lose anti-corrosion and other additive protection. That's also why, although you won't find it stated on a container, it is a good idea to shake the container of fresh antifreeze and shake it again before adding it to the engine cooling system. The little extra shake is insurance that the additives are fully suspended in the container and haven't migrated to the bottom.

What all this is telling us is that when you purchase coolant for you engine, it is best to purchase premixed coolant. Some argue that you are paying for water. That may be true but knowing that you have the correct mixture is worth the extra cost. If you purchase pure antifreeze it is preferred to mix the antifreeze and deionized water in a clean container and verify the correct mixture using a refractometer before installing it into your vehicles cooling system.

Although there are many techniques available a refractometer should be used to measure the glycol /water ratio because it offers the most reliable method to identify the precise glycol content of the coolant. This determines the level of freeze protection and ensures the proper concentrations of corrosion inhibitors.
