This 2007 Saturn Sky was purchased new by the original owner on August 23, 2006. It has never been driven in the rain or snow either by the original owner or by us. We purchased it on April 12, 2019. The mileage at that time was 22,130 miles.

The original owner was very meticulous in keeping mileage and maintenance records over the years. All of those records were passed on to us at the time of purchase.

Steve Heinemann, Club Vice-President, made us aware of the availability of this car. He said that he would buy it if we did not.

It has been a very reliable and fun car to drive. We have experienced gas mileage as high as 29+ MPG using a light foot, but as low as 17 MPG if you have a heavy foot.

Upgrades made by the original owner include intake manifold changes, tires and improved exhaust system components. It has a 2.4 liter 4 cylinder engine with automatic transmission, independent rear suspension, air conditioning cruise control and a manual top.

The World Trade Center was a complex of several buildings around a central plaza in New York City. On any given day, some 50,000 people would work at or visit the World Trade Center. The most notable feature of the complex was the twin towers, each with 110 stories. With a height of nearly 1400 feet, they were 100 feet taller than the Empire State Building. In fact, when they were completed in 1972 (tower one) and 1973 (tower two), the towers briefly held the record as the world's tallest buildings. Chicago's Sears Tower, however, would climb to 1450 feet.

To provide backup electrical power for emergency situations, six Waukesha V12 diesel generating units, each rated at 1200 kW, were installed during the construction of the World Trade Center. The engine/generator units were located in sub-basement 6, the lowest level, on the west side of tower one.

On September 11, 2001, the twin towers collapsed in a terrorist attack when two commercial jetliners were crashed into them. More than 3000 people, including fire and rescue workers, were killed. It is believed the engines came on line in a valiant attempt to supply emergency power, even if it was for a brief period.




