Jim Young (2) Dennis Wagner Al Schultz Victor Perugini I purchased my 63 Vette from North Star Motors in Milwaukee back in 1973 for \$2500. I was just 18 years old and right out of High School. When I went to pick it up I found that the car had been stolen. The car was found about a week later and the dealer asked if I was still interested in buying it. A lot had been striped out of the car such as engine and transmission, the hood, the radiator, the seats, the radio, thle gauges and the Crager SS chrome wheels and Hooker chrome side exhaust pipes.

I still went ahead and purchased the car for a much reduced price of \$825. Little by little my dad, friends and auto repair shops helped me get the car back to running condition in 1974. I then had the car painted candy "brandy wine" with a silver base coat in 1975 because it was in need of a paint job. That by the way was done by Steve's Custom Classics in Milwaukee for \$2000 which included recutting in and installing the front headlight modules which had been glassed in.

I have a lot of stories that go with the car, too many to share, but I still have the car today. My wife and I were dating at the time and eventually got married and drove ourselves around on our wedding day and home from the reception in that car, which I wouldn't recommend doing today.

Fast forward some 42 years and I still have the car. I didn't use it much however I drove it every summer. By this time it needed another paint job. So I searched around for places that would do this sort of thing and finally chose Nagel Auto Body in Waukesha. This was completed in 2018 which was in the shop for approximately one year. It was sad to see him sell the business shortly thereafter. I had it painted to the original factory color which was black. It also has a black interior with the original hub caps. A 327cid engine with a 600 cfm holly carburetor, 4 speed transmission with a Hurst shifter. It turned out beautiful.

Cars and More Auctioned at Elmer's Toy Museum

MORE THAN 2,000 CARS AND CAR RELATED

items came up for bid at Elmer's Auto and Toy Museum in Fountain City, Wisconsin, with the Mecum-held auction achieving a total of \$8.5 million in total sales. Most of the cars that changed hands needed some servicing, as they were display vehicles that had endured long-term storage over the years. Among the many fixer uppers and projects was a 1964 Amphicar 770. Perhaps the most famous dual purpose production vehicles was finished in white and red with a black top and white interior. It showed 6,556 miles on the odometer and its four cylinder engine was mated to a Hermes four speed land and water transmission. It had been a while since it had used either its land or sea-legs, as it was last registered in 1977. In an odd coincidence, the Amphicar 770 last driven in 1977 sold for \$77,000.

Among the pedal cars, toys, petroliana, and automobilia to sell was an original 1929 Snap-On wooden tool box. Snap-On recently celebrated its centennial and this toolbox, which was a time capsule of the company's early years received lively bidding. It was in original condition and the wood had a lot of scars, paint stains, chips and wear. The casters were original and all the drawers were present and accounted for. Best of all, each drawer featured period-correct original contents from tools to hardware and more. Vintage decals and stickers served as old-school passport stamps for this piece of garage history. The wooden toolbox and its contents sold for \$35,400. Full results from Elmer's are now available at mecum.com
