Member Dues

Membership dues are \$40.00 per year.

Dues are due on February 15 of each year.

Members receive a 50% discount on dues by working a minimum 4 hours for the club throughout the year.

Members who have not paid their dues by the due date will not receive credit for hours worked and will have their name removed from the club roster.



The name Impala was first introduced in 1956 at the GM Motorama as a 5 passenger Corvette concept car. It seemed fitting to be named after the Impala, a gazelle that can leap up to 30 feet.

In 1958 GM brought out unique models for all their car lines to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the Chevrolet. The Impala name was bought out as a trim level upgrade to the popular Chevrolet Bel Air. It was only available as a sport coupe or convertible. From the A pillar back it was a completely different car than the other Chevrolet models, with a shorter roof line and longer trunk.

In 1959 the Impala became a stand-alone model. In 1961 the Super Sport option was introduced with an available Big Block 409. In 1962 the SS option became a trim level option. However it could still be ordered with high performance engine and suspension packages.

The 1962-64 cars were the last to use the X frame when Chevrolet went back to the perimeter frame in 1965. The Boxy 1962-64 Impalas have remained popular with the low-rider culture.

The Impala reigned as the top of the full sized Chevrolet lineup until 1966 when the Caprice was introduced. By 1976 the Biscayne and Bel Air had been dropped and the Impala was the entry level full sized Chevrolet.

In 1986 the name Impala was dropped until it returned at the 1992 Auto Show as a tricked out Caprice with a sport suspension and a big V-8.

From 1958 until 1975, the Impala was distinguished by having three-segment taillights, while lesser full sized Chevys including the Bel Air, Biscayne, and Delray had two and the wagons had one (the exception being 1959 when all versions had cat-eye taillights).

The 2006 Impala SS was the first front-wheel-drive Chevrolet with a V-8 engine, and in 2013 it was the last American built car with a bench seat.

The Impala has served as both the high end (1958-1965) and the low end (1976-1985) of Chevrolet's full-size lineup.

The last Impala was produced in 2020, but keep a lookout it may come back again.

Should the club dissolve, all material goods and assets will be donated to charities of the club membership's choice.


