There were 21,380 Thunderbirds built in 1957 each with one of three engine options.

There were 19,820 D-Code built (312 V-8 engine with a single four barrel carburetor).

There were 1363 E-Code built (312 V-8 engine with dual four barrel carburetor).

There were 197 F-Code built (312 V-8 engine with a single four barrel carburetor and a Paxton Phase 1 Supercharger).

There are only 40 F-Code Thunderbirds known to exist today

# FEATURE CAR 1957 Ford Thunderbird F-Code

The Ford Thunderbird was developed to compete with the Chevrolet Corvette. The Thunderbird went from idea to prototype in less than a year using mostly off the shelf parts. The main differences between the Corvette and Thunderbird was that the Corvette was marketed as a sports car whereas the Thunderbird was marketed as a 2 seat personal luxury car. Also, the Corvette was only available with the Blue Flame 6 and two speed Powerglide transmission, where as the Thunderbird came standard with the 292 cubic inch Y-block V-8, from the Mercury division, with either a manual or automatic transmission.

The 1955 Thunderbird sold extremely well, out selling the Corvette 23 to 1.

For 1956 a few changes were made. The spare tire was moved out of trunk and mounted on the rear bumper to gain more trunk space and vents were added to the front fenders to provide better air circulation to the cabin, and the 312 cu. in. V-8 became available as an option.

For 1957 again more options became available. The Thunderbird F-Code was available for only one year to homologate the car for NASCAR. The F-Code came with a high-performance 312 V-8 with a four barrel carburetor and a Paxton Phase 1 Super Charger and heavy duty 3 speed manual overdrive transmission. One of the F-Code Thunderbirds set a speed record of 138.755 mph at Daytona Speed Trials which surpassed the record set by a Corvette the prior year by 6 mph. Later that year, the same car set record

of 160+ mph at Bonneville speed trials. Thus began the Ford Supercharger program.
