The fourth-generation Corvette, also known as the C4, was produced from 1984 to 1996. While the C4 Corvette will not go down in history as the fastest or most popular Corvette in history, However it moved the Corvette forward from the old C3 muscle car to a car that started to compete with the offerings from Ferrari and Lamborghini. While the C4 was scheduled to be introduced in the early 1980's, the car was eventually pushed for a 1983 model year release. Multiple pre-production cars were built, but at the last minute, the car was pulled from production. Although the 1983 Corvette was canceled, a total of 61 cars were produced. 18 were proto-types and 43 were pilot production cars. Of these 43 pilot production cars, all were destroyed except for one. This is the story of the only surviving 1983 Corvette.

In the 1970's new regulations for emissions, fuel economy, and safety were introduced. This caused many problems for the designers of the C4 Corvette to overcome. While the Corvette was being modified to meet these new regulations the 1983 model year was coming to an end. Which meant the C4 would not be ready for the 1983 model year. Even though only 43 pilot cars of the 1983 Corvettes were produced, they were all ordered to be crushed. When GM ordered that all 43 of the 1983 C4 Corvettes were to be crushed, it was decided for convenience that it would be easier to rent a crusher and have them crushed at the Bowling Green, Kentucky plant where they were produced. In June of 1982, Ralph Montileone, a worker at the plant, was assigned to use the mobile crusher to destroy all of the 1983 Corvettes that had been built. Montileone proceeded to crush the cars, one by one, until he got to the last car, number 23. When out of nowhere, a downpour started. Montileone decided that since he had just purchased a new pair of expensive cowboy boots and didn't want them ruined by the rain that started to flood the parking lot, he would save the final car to be crushed the next morning. When Montileone arrived at the plant the following day, the mobile crusher was gone. During the night the rental company came and took the crusher away, leaving number 23 sitting there as the lone surviving car. While the one and only surviving 1983 Corvette faced the crusher and lived, the story did not end there. After the crusher was removed from the plant property, Montileone decided to park the number 23 in the back lot of the plant. There it sat for several years until it was discovered by a new plant manager who noticed the lone white Corvette sitting in the back of the parking lot and found out that it was a 1983 model, although all records indicated that they were all crushed. It was decided that this car would be refurbished and be brought into the front lobby of the Corvette plant, and it would be on display as the only surviving 1983 Corvette. The car is currently on display in the Corvette Museum.






































